

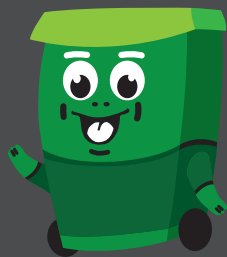
# WHAT GOES IN FOGO, AND SOME COMMON ITEMS THAT DON'T!

	Baking Paper		Corks (any type)
	Barbecue Skewers (bamboo)		Curries (best if frozen)
	Biodegradable plastic bags		Cutlery (plastic)
	Bones – meat and seafood		Cutlery (corn starch)
	Branches <10 cm diameter		Dairy products
	Bread – crusts, stale or mouldy		Dental floss pick (any type)
	Bricks		Dog or cat faeces
	Building materials		Dust
	Car parts		Egg cartons
	Cardboard		Egg shells
	Cartons, such as milk or juice cartons (including lids and caps)		Expired food (without packaging)
	Cat Litter		Feathers (only fresh plucked chicken feathers)
	Ceramics		Fibre-based kitchen caddy liners (paper or newspaper)
	Cereal		Fish/seafood waste - bones, skin, shells and scraps
	Certified compostable packaging, cutlery, containers, cups, straws, stirrers		Fish & Chips paper
	Charcoal		Flowers
	Cheese		Food in containers (the food can go in FOGO but not the container)
	Chewing Gum/ Bubble Gum		Food scraps
	Chicken bones/ skins/ scraps		Fruit – peels, cores, seeds and scraps
	Chopsticks (Wooden or Bamboo)		Garden Cuttings
	Christmas Tree (real)		Glass bottles and jars (including lids and seals)
	Christmas Tree (plastic)		Grains

# WHAT GOES IN FOGO, AND SOME COMMON ITEMS THAT DON'T!

✓	Iceblock/paddle pop sticks
✗	Ice Cream containers (plastic lined paper or plastic)
✗	Junk mail
✗	Juice Cartons (tetra pak, foil lined)
✗	Kitty litter - clay, paper based or plastic
✗	Leather products - bags, shoes, other
✓	Leaves
✓	Leftover cooked food
✗	Logs - larger than 10cm in diameter
✗	Magazines and glossy paper
✓	Meat bones & skins
✓	Meat scraps (raw or cooked)
✗	Medical waste
✗	Metal Tins & Cans
✓	Milk (including non-dairy milks)
✓	Mouldy food
✗	Nails - human and pet
✗	Napkins/serviettes
✗	Nappies (including compostable ones)
✗	Needles and syringes
✓	Newspaper (for lining your caddy or wrapping food only)
✓	Nuts (including shells and husks)
✓	Oyster shells
✗	Paints and poisons
✗	Palm fronds & palm tree nuts
✗	Paper - shredded or dirty/oily
✗	Paper bags (except for lining your caddy - Recycle first)
✗	Paper napkins (except for lining your caddy or wrapping food)
✗	Paper or plastic condiment sachets (e.g., sugar, salt, pepper sachets)
✗	Paper plates
✗	Paper towels (except for lining your caddy or wrapping food)
✓	Pasta (cooked or uncooked)
✓	Pet food

✗	Pet poo and kitty litter
✓	Pet hay or straw
✗	Pizza boxes
✓	Plant cuttings
✗	Plant pots
✗	Plastic bags
✓	Pruning (<10cm in diameter)
✗	Recyclable items
✗	Recyclable plastic containers
✓	Rice (cooked or uncooked)
✗	Rocks
✗	Sand
✓	Sauces such as tomato sauce or relishes (without packaging)
✓	Seafood and shells
✓	Seeds
✓	Shellfish waste
✗	Shredded paper
✓	Skin - fish, chicken
✗	Soil
✓	Straw or Hay
✓	Tea bags (only if the bag doesn't contain plastic)
✓	Tea Leaves
✗	Textiles - bedding, cleaning cloths, carpets
✓	Timber (untreated, unpainted, uncoated, <10cm in diameter)
✗	Tissues
✗	Toilet roll / paper towel cardboard inners
✗	Toothpick
✓	Twigs & sticks (<10cm in diameter)
✗	Vacuum waste
✓	Vegetables - peels, cores, seeds and scraps
✓	Weeds
✗	Wipes (including compostable ones)
✓	Yogurt
