


Dubbo Regional Council aims to provide and support a range of waste education opportunities for the whole community.

Dubbo Regional Council provides engaging syllabus linked sustainability workshops tailored for students from Kindergarten to Year 6.



TEXTILE RECYCLING

Dubbo Regional Council offers opportunity shops and residents a free textile recycling service. Items that cannot be sold in store can be disposed of at Whylandra Waste and Recycling Centre, where they are bagged and sent for recycling. Quantities larger than 20kgs are accepted, but we request that you contact Whylandra Waste and Recycling Centre to arrange a suitable time for drop off on 02 6801 4900 for larger quantities.

AVAILABLE KERBSIDE WASTE SERVICES

Council have kerbside waste services available for commercial (non-domestic) waste needs.

Kerbside organics (FOGO) and recycling services are less expensive than general waste (land\text{\text{!II}}) services. Over half the items in the average red bin could be rescued and recycled, or composted through FOGO.

By signing up for Council's FOGO and recycling services you can:

- Save money in comparison to land!Il costs
- Help to save water, energy, and resources by diverting more from land!ll
- Reduce your business emissions
