This past weekend, Dubbo transformed into a bustling hub of activity and excitement as we proudly hosted the 2024 NSW Touch Junior State Cup - Northern Conference. The event was a monumental success, drawing in an estimated 9,000 junior touch football stars along with their families and supporters. The Lady Cutler Sporting Precinct, with its impeccably prepared grounds, became the centre of action as 202 teams from across the northern half of New South Wales competed in a display of skill, teamwork, and sportsmanship.

The quality of the event was evident in the glowing testimonials shared across social media platforms. Attendees praised the exceptional condition of the lelds, with some mistaking the natural turf for artilicial due to its impeccable state. The efforts of our staff in preparing the venue did not go unnoticed, earning widespread acclaim for their dedication to excellence.
