

MRL Budget 2022-2023









- The member councils' annual contribution rate of a 3% increase on the previous year (2021/2022) is not sustainable to maintain existing service levels
- Historically, contributions rates have changed over the years, e.g., 9% contribution (2014-2017)
- Changing contribution rates create a divergence in contribution equity over time
- Population trends reflect Dubbo LGA increasing population and Warrumbungle and Narromine Shires decreasing populations
- Operational costs continue to rise, e.g., courier costs (30%), software/hardware licences, online database and subscription services, technology, Workers Compensation
