EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The draft Rural Heritage Review project has now been completed and was publicly exhibited between 11 April 2002 and 10 May 2002. The project was a 'community based heritage review' having the direct involvement of specialist community interest groups and residents of the rural community. The draft Rural Heritage Review makes recommendations to Council regarding the inclusion of additional items in the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 1997 – Rural Areas and for amendments to the LEP for conservation of heritage items.

The draft Review Report makes recommendations for the future management of heritage within the rural area including:

- The establishment of a Local Heritage Fund (\$15,000), with Council to provide \$7,500 which is to be matched by the NSW Heritage Office.
- Restoration and conservation of the "Serisier Vault" and "Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery".
- Amendments to the Dubbo Rural LEP to allow subdivision and provide for additional dwellings in certain circumstances to ensure the conservation of listed heritage items, otherwise prohibited by the LEP.
- Council providing support to amendments to the taxation system that would enable tax deductions for money spent on conservation works by owners of listed heritage items.
- Council allowing for 'rate reductions/discounts' for the time spent on conservation work on listed heritage items.
- Council providing donations equivalent to development application fees for applications relating to conservation work on listed heritage items.
- Electronic mapping of all listed heritage items to assist with future management.
- Implementation of measures to promote heritage items and tourism where owners agree.

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- Negotiation of Conservation Management Plans (CMP) for heritage items of State Significance.
- Ongoing review and monitoring of heritage matters on a regular basis.
- Miscellaneous recommendations relating to investigation, assessment and management of heritage items such as recording and demolition controls.

The public exhibition process generated twenty seven (27) submissions with only two (2) submissions objecting. The majority of the community were supportive of the draft Rural Heritage Review as proposed while the two objections related to existing local heritage items, which are proposed to be maintained as locally listed heritage items.

Council's Heritage Sub-Committee considered the draft Review at its meeting on 21 May 2002 and resolved to adopt the draft Rural Heritage Review as prepared.

The adoption of the draft Report is recommended and this shall have implications on Council's policies and finances as outlined herein.

REPORT

Background

The Dubbo Rural Heritage Review was a joint project between Council and the NSW Heritage Office. The Review was a 'Community Based Heritage Review', which included the establishment and involvement of a 'Working Group' comprising:

- An appointed Heritage Coordinator (Ms Barbara Hickson);
- An Historian (Mr Terry Kass);
- Councillors (Councillors Fardell and Duncan);
- Council staff (Strategic Planner 2 Mr Tim Deverell);
- Specialist local heritage and historical groups (Dubbo Museum, National Trust and Macquarie Regional Library); and, importantly
- Several community representatives (Mr Stan Berry, Mrs Margaret Kelly, Mrs Rosemary Langford, Mr Scott Tourle and Mrs Helen Whitely).

Aboriginal community representatives were also invited to participate, but they did not respond to invitations.

The purpose of the project was to:

- Review existing knowledge of European heritage places and/or items;
- Identify new heritage places and/or items;

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- Develop an electronic Heritage Inventory (the 'State Heritage Inventory' or SHI) with detailed historical information on items/places/people; and
- Conserve/manage the heritage of the rural area for the community.

The Review was not restricted to just buildings, and included natural heritage such as landscapes and settings.

The process included identifying heritage items/places which 'fit' with various historical themes. For example, European settlement and occupation, exploration, transport, domestic life, education, social institutions, etc and conversely to see that these 'themes' were represented by appropriate examples of heritage place items.

The Rural Review consists of four (4) Volumes:

Volume 1 - Dubbo Rural Heritage Review (attached);

Volume 2 – Village Histories;

Volume 3 - Heritage Inventory Items;

Volume 4 - Heritage Inventory Items.

Volumes 2-4 will be available in the Councillors' anteroom.

Community Consultation

Consultation and participation of the Dubbo rural community was actively sought and involved two (2) separate public meetings at each of the following villages - Ballimore, Eumungerie, Rawsonville, Toongi and Wongarbon.

Prior to the Review there were 33 listed heritage items (local heritage significance) contained in the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997 – Rural Areas (Dubbo Rural LEP).

The project identified a total of approximately 105 places and these were subsequently investigated during the process in conjunction with owners, where possible, to determine the importance and significance of these heritage places to the community.

Draft Recommendations

The Review recommends that Council, consider adding a further 58 items/places as local 'heritage items' in the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997 – Rural Areas. These items are listed on page 6 and 7 of the draft Rural Heritage Review report. Therefore, many but not all identified heritage places have been recommended for formal 'heritage listing'.

The Review recommends that 12 heritage items/places be nominated for further consideration as being of 'State Heritage Significance'. These are listed on pages 9 and 10 of the Draft Rural Heritage Review report and include:

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- 1. The Meadows
- 2. The Springs Group
- 3. Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery
- 4. Dicki Gundy Inn
- Serisier Vault
- 6. Ballimore Village
- 7. Dulcidene Homestead
- 8. Minore Falls
- 9. Barbigal Hill
- 10. Murrumbidgerie former Coach House
- 11. Rawsonville Soldiers Memorial Hall
- 12. Old Harbour Lagoon

The Review suggests general management actions for each nominated site to assist with conservation, and contains a brief history of the Dubbo rural area and the villages including an outline of common or representative building materials and techniques.

The Review makes the following recommendations for consideration subject to Council adoption for the future management and conservation of heritage items including:

- The establishment of a Local Heritage Fund (\$15 000) to assist owners of listed heritage items with conservation works. Council to provide \$7 500 which is to be matched by the NSW Heritage Office. This fund is to assist owners of listed heritage items to undertake conservation works upon the recommendation of Council's Heritage Advisor.
- Restoration of the "Serisier Vault" (located on "Eumalga Park", Old Dubbo Rd, Dubbo) fully funded with Council's financial assistance, though the owner and descendants shall also be approached to contribute. (SHI 1520470).
- Restoration and conservation of the "Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery" (located off Angle Rd, Dubbo) with Council's financial assistance, (the descendants shall also be approached to contribute) and ongoing management (SHI 1520468).

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- Amendments to the Dubbo Rural LEP to allow subdivision and provide for additional dwellings in certain circumstances to ensure the conservation of listed heritage items, otherwise prohibited by the LEP.
- Council supporting amendments to the tax system that would enable tax deductions for money spent on conservation works by owners of listed heritage items.
- Council allowing for 'rate reductions/discounts' for the time spent on conservation work on listed heritage items.
- Council providing donations equivalent to development application fees for applications relating to conservation work on listed heritage items.
- Electronic mapping of all listed heritage items to assist with future management.
- Implementation of measures to promote heritage items and tourism where owners agree.
- Negotiation of Conservation Management Plans (CMP) for heritage items of State Significance.
- Ongoing review and monitoring of heritage matters on a regular basis.
- Miscellaneous recommendations relating to investigation, assessment and management of heritage items such as recording and demolition controls.

Public Exhibition

The draft Rural Heritage Review was placed on public exhibition from 11 April 2002 until 10 May 2002. Exhibition consisted of the following:

- A series of advertisements were placed in the Daily Liberal and 'press releases' were also issued to assist in promotion of the exhibition.
- Formal displays were erected in the foyer of Council's Administration Building and in the Macquarie Regional Library.
- Informal displays were provided at the Post Offices in Eumungerie and Wongarbon and in the Public Hotels of those two villages and Ballimore.
- Ballimore and District Community Association were also contacted directly and met with Council staff and the Heritage Consultant during the exhibition period to provide

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additional information regarding the proposed nomination of Ballimore village in its entirety for State Heritage listing.

In addition, letters and explanatory material have been sent to all of the owners of
existing and/or proposed heritage places/items seeking comment regarding the proposed
management and changes which may affect their item.

At the conclusion of the public exhibition period and accounting for late submissions, the number and types of submission are summarised in the following table:

A detailed 'summary' of all submissions is included as Appendix 1 to this report. This includes the draft recommendations by the Rural Heritage Review Working Party in response to all public submissions.

Copies of submissions by way of support or objection are provided under separate cover. Copies of additional information provided for any item have not been included in this report but will be made available in the Councillors' room.

The Rural Heritage Review Working Party also referred the draft Report to Council's Heritage Sub-Committee for comment as the recommendations involved the potential listing of many additional heritage items, theoretically influencing the operations of the Sub-Committee. The Sub-Committee resolved at their meeting of 21 May 2002 to adopt the draft Rural Heritage Review as prepared and supported the recommendations contained there.

Whilst the rural community and the owners of nominated heritage items overwhelmingly supported the general intent and recommendations of the Rural Heritage Review, it is relevant to particularly examine the submissions by way of 'objection' that were received as part of the public exhibition process.

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There were two (2) objections received relating to three (3) existing listed heritage items under the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997. The Rural Heritage Review Working Party makes the recommendations as to each submission (objection) as noted in the following table:

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It should also be noted that all owners of heritage items nominated for some form of new or modified heritage listing will have an additional opportunity to provide further comment with future amendments to the Rural Local Environmental Plan 1997 – Rural Areas.

Finally, to conclude the public exhibition process associated with the Rural Heritage Review, a tour of selected heritage items and items nominated for heritage listing or works was held on 10 May 2002. The tour was attended by five (5) Councillors, most of the members of the Rural Heritage Review Working Party and Council staff. The tour inspected the Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery, Butlers Falls, Serisier Vault, "Cranbrook", "The Meadows" and concluded at "The Springs".

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

The Rural Heritage Review is fully funded from the 2001-2002 budget. The project has been costed at \$20,000, with \$10,000 being provided by the NSW Heritage Office as grant funding specifically for this project.

The Rural Heritage Review recommends that Council allocates some funds (in conjunction with the NSW Heritage Office and others) for the restoration work to the Serisier Vault and Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery. This work will need to be programmed into Council's Management Plan and Budget.

In addition and separate to the proposed restoration of the Serisier Vault and Old Dubbo Pioneer Cemetery is the establishment of a Local Heritage Fund. This would require Council to allocate a maximum of \$7,500 which will then be met 'dollar for dollar' (\$ for \$) by the NSW Heritage Office. This money is then spent on conserving listed heritage items upon the recommendation of Council's Heritage Advisor.

The draft Report also makes recommendations to Council regarding rating and development application fee donations for conservation works to listed heritage items. Costing of these aspects is difficult, as it is unknown as to how many listed heritage items may be restored/conserved in any given period, for how long, or whether actual Council consent is required for the proposed works. It is not expected that the donation of Development Application fees will be significant, however it will impact upon Council's income in a minor way.

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POLICY IMPLICATIONS

Subject to Council's adoption of the draft Rural Heritage Review, there may be policy amendments to the following policies/plans required:

- Dubbo Rural Area Development Strategy regarding conservation of heritage items and permitting subdivisions and dwellings otherwise in accordance with Council's current policy in the rural areas. Logically these inclusions may also be considered for the Dubbo Urban Areas Development Strategy.
- Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997 Rural Areas for inclusion of additional heritage items, subdivision, additional dwelling provisions and demolition controls as they relate to heritage items. Logically these inclusions may also be considered for the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1998 – Urban Areas.
- Revenue Policy discounts, concessions or donations equivalent to rates and/or development application fees relating to listed heritage items for conservation works.

RECOMMENDATION:

- 1. That the draft Rural Heritage Review be adopted subject to the following modifications:
 - a) The "Dicki Gundi Inn" be maintained as a local heritage item only within the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997 Rural Areas. Nomination for state heritage listing to be deferred until the agreement of the current or future owner is secured.
 - b) That "Boothenba Woolshed" and "Boothenba Silo" be maintained as local heritage items within the Dubbo Local Environmental Plan 1997 Rural Areas.
- 2. That all persons who made submissions be advised of Council's resolution in the matter.
- 3. That the recommendations from the Rural Heritage Review regarding amendments to the Dubbo Local Environment Plan 1997 Rural Areas be incorporated in the next programmed amendment of that LEP.

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4. That a review of heritage within the urban area of Dubbo be programmed into the Sustainable Development Policy Branch Function Plan to align with the outcomes of the Rural Heritage Review.
