

FLUORIDE DOSING SYSTEM WORKING IN WELLINGTON

Dubbo Regional Council (DRC) are excited to advise the community a new §uoride pump has been installed at the Wellington Water Treatment Plant with §uoride dosing for Wellington's water recommencing.

As a result §uoride treated water is now being supplied to all areas including Wellington township, Montelores, Nanima Village, Wellington Caves, Wellington Correctional Centre and Macquarie Correctional Centre.

Dubbo Regional Council alerted residents to the failure of the Fluoride Dosing System at Wellington's Water Treatment Plant earlier this month.

At the time there was an expected timeframe of Mid-March for delivery of a new system, which remains on order.

However, Council staff have been able to modify the §uoride pump not being used at Dubbo's John Gilbert Water Treatment Plant.

"This is a fantastic outcome for the Wellington community and those

who use Wellington's potable water supply," Acting Director

Infrastructure Chris Godfrey said.

"Operational staff advised us earlier this month the pump could not be

repaired and needed to be replaced, with a pump having to be sourced

from Germany.

"Staff have worked hard to secure a new §uoride dosing pump within a

much shorter than anticipated timeframe, allowing the §uoride system

to be re-established.

The Fluoride Treatment at the Dubbo facility requires a complete rebuild

of §uoridation infrastructure with the tender process for a contractor

being undertaken.

The water produced at the Wellington Water Treatment Plant has always

been maintained to the highest level and has met the required control

points for provision of safe drinking water during the process.
